

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SCHEME OF EXAMINATION
B.A.(Honours) Part - II Examination
(10 + 2+3 Pattern)

R. 11 (1):

For a pass at each examination, a candidate shall be required to obtain a minimum of 36% marks in each subsidiary subject and 40% in the Honours subject passing separately in the practicals wherever prescribed shall be necessary. Successful candidates will be classified as under :

First Division 60% } of the aggregate marks prescribed
Second Division 50% } Honours and subsidiary subjects of Pt.
I, Pt. II and Pt. III examinations taken
together.

All the rest will be declared to have passed the examination.

No division shall be awarded at the Honours Pt. I and Pt. II examinations.

The number of papers and practicals, wherever prescribed, the duration of examination, maximum marks and minimum pass marks are shown in the relevant syllabus.


